# Our Report to the Community

We will not soon forget 2020. Like me, you probably got tired of hearing the word *unprecedented*. Your community foundation managed to overcome the obstacles and end the year on a positive note. As always, we celebrate you, your friends and neighbors, all of whom have helped us make an impact this year and in the past. You—and many others like you—are improving our community and deserve our profound gratitude.

In this report of our activities in 2020, we highlight the generosity of many people, how we’ve invested the money that has been given, and the grants we have distributed from our funds. We also report

about the second annual *Crawford Gives* and the more than \$370,000 that was raised in one day! We received a significant amount in charitable gifts and new funds were established. We now manage 150 endowed funds from which we have distributed more than \$9.8 million in grants since 1998. Our funds benefit more than 100 different organizations, scholarships and charitable purposes. As more is entrusted to us, we’re able to give more to improve Crawford County.

Our mission is to connect generous people in our community with worthwhile charitable causes. Our donors give towards scholarships, interest areas (such as the arts, education or the environment) and specific nonprofit organizations. Many simply ask us to give their money where it is most needed.

We permanently invest a significant portion of the money that is given to us.

Each and every year—forever—a percentage is paid to support charitable organizations, programs and scholarships. Most were designated by our donors to receive grants every year. Our donors have also empowered us to direct a small number of grants where we think they will do the most good. As a fund grows, more money goes to support these philanthropic purposes. Much more than the amount originally given will be paid out over time.

We accept gifts in many forms including cash, stock, bonds and property. You can make gifts during your lifetime or leave a bequest through instructions in your will. When you notify us of your intentions to leave a bequest, we’ll show our appreciation by enrolling you in our *Dwight Haas Bequest Society*. We hope you will think about your charitable giving and how you can make a difference in our community.

Your support is truly appreciated. We hope we can count on you to continue to help us build a strong foundation for a better community.

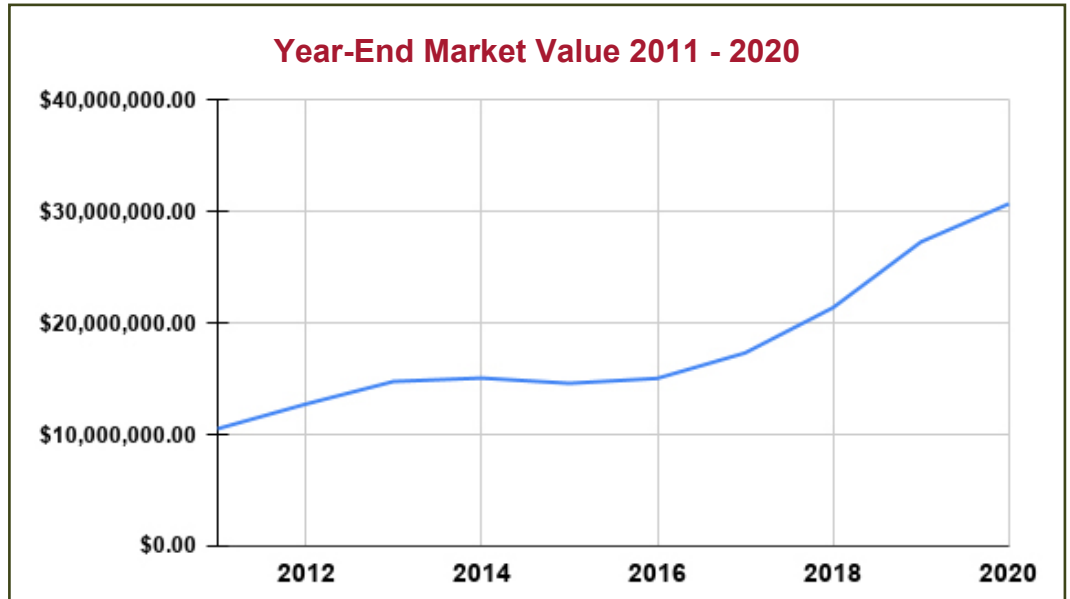
# Stewardship

Over the last five years we have grown by more than \$15 million. That is an average of more than \$3.1 million in gifts and investment returns each year.

We closed the books on 2020 with \$30,719,754.20 in assets under management. This was an increase of 11.89% from year-end 2019 when we had \$27,305,962.67.

Our one-year investment return was more than 12 percent in December. The return on investment for the five-year period was more than 10 percent.

We have continued our fund management relationships with four financial institutions—PNC, First National Bank of Pennsylvania, Northwest Savings Bank, and ErieBank. Each institution maintained compliance with our *Administrative and Spending Policies and Operating Procedures*.

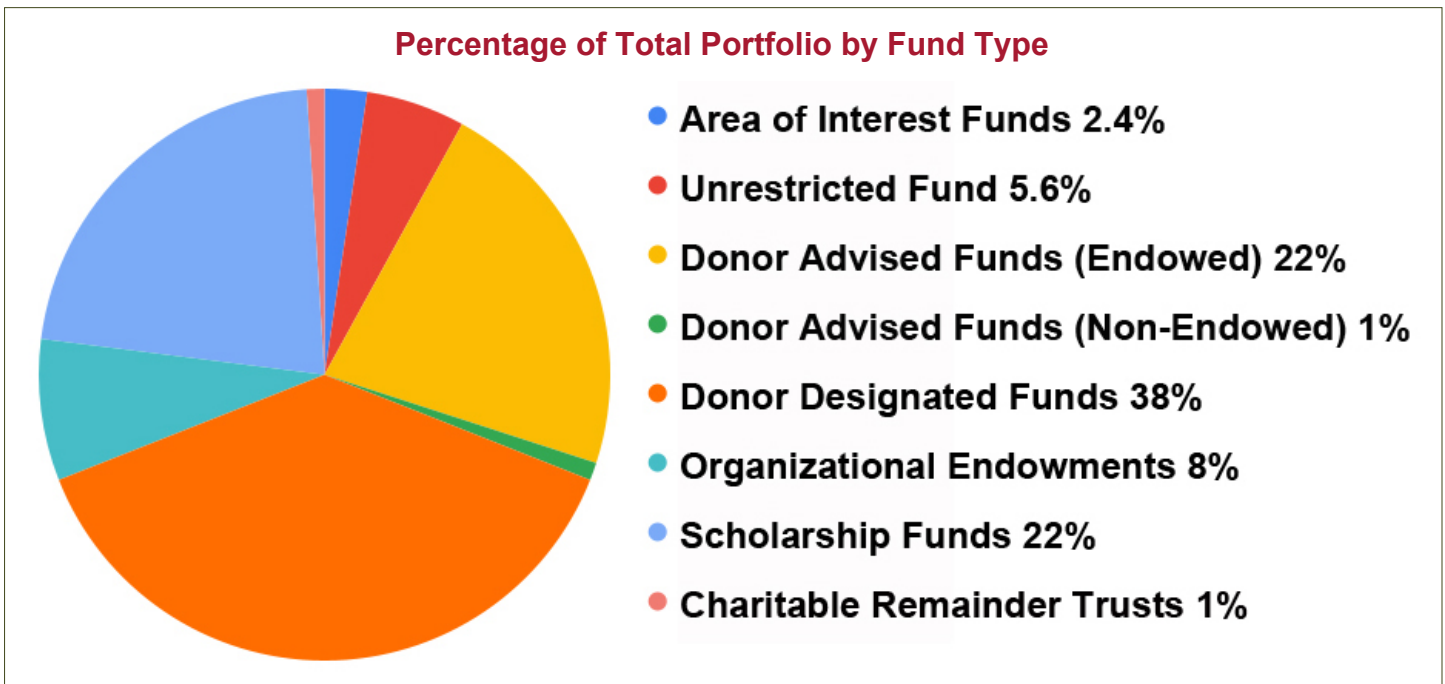


We distributed 4 percent of the value of each of our permanently endowed funds in 2020.

**Annual Audit:** We complete a yearly audit to meet regulatory requirements and to demonstrate our financial integrity to the community. Our year-end financial statements for 2018 were audited by McGill, Power, Bell & Associates, LLP.

The auditors' opinion was that our financial statements

presented fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Crawford Heritage Community Foundation. This is the highest level of assurance that an auditor can provide. ## About Us

The Crawford Heritage Community Foundation is dedicated to making Crawford County, Pennsylvania a better place to live, learn, work and raise a family. We help people make the most of their philanthropy by giving to endowed funds. Grant awards are made from these funds to support the causes our donors care about as well as worthwhile programs we select. We manage more than 100 funds, which benefit more than 100 different organizations, scholarships and charitable purposes. More than \$10 million has been awarded since our establishment in 1998.

## Financial Accountability

Our activities are guided by board-approved policies for investment and spending. We use professional investment managers who follow strict fiduciary standards and are audited annually by an independent accounting firm. We provides regular reports to our donors and publish our financial statements and grantmaking summaries each year.

We have proud to have earned the Guidestar Exchange Seal, at the Silver Level, for being transparent and proactive in providing information and documents to help donors and funders make their giving decisions.

## A Vibrant Form of Philanthropy

The Crawford Heritage Community Foundation is one of more than 700 community foundations in the United States. Together, community foundations comprise the fastest growing form of philanthropy in the nation.

### Benjamin Franklin's Legacy

Benjamin Franklin's foresight and generosity are an example to us all. He left instructions in his will for a gift of \$5,000 (more than \$120,000 in today's dollars) that was to be invested for 200 years. At the end of that period he directed that the money be used to benefit residents of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the City of Philadelphia.

In 1991, a portion of the \$2 million that had accrued was distributed to Pennsylvania's community foundations. The Crawford Heritage Community Foundation continues to invest Mr. Franklin's money (*Ben Franklin Trust*) and distributes a percentage each year to benefit grantmaking in Crawford County.

# Giving

In 2020 we received 3,427 gifts from hundreds of people and organizations who gave \$1,481,281.81 to establish new funds, add to twenty-three existing funds and pass-through gifts to 118 organizations through **Crawford Gives**.

## Scholarship Funds

Two scholarship funds were created. These endowed funds will provide a permanent source of financial support for their charitable purposes. They are permanently invested and each year a percentage of their value is paid out as grants. More money is granted as the endowments grow.

The Franklin Section of the American Society of Highway Engineers (ASHE) established the *BJ Smith Scholarship Fund* with a bequest from the estate of Burnell (BJ) Smith of Meadville. BJ was a long-time member of the ASHE and received their National Man of the Year Award in 1989. The scholarship is awarded annually to one or more students who are pursuing a degree in civil engineering or transportation/highway fields.

A dedicated committee of volunteers established the *R. Budd Dwyer Scholarship* in 1987 as a memorial. They have worked diligently in the ensuing decades to raise money and provide annual awards that underwrite a small portion of the cost of higher education for selected students residing in Blooming Valley Borough each year. The volunteer committee

recognized the need to ensure that the scholarship would operate in perpetuity and transferred administration to the community foundation in September. Each and every year—forever—we will distribute a percentage of the value of the fund for its stated purpose.

## Donor Advised Funds

Donor advised funds are a flexible option for donors who may wish to vary

their charitable giving recommendations from year-to-year. These funds can be endowed or non-endowed. Endowed funds grant a set percentage of the fund total each year. Non-endowed funds may be spent down completely if the donor wishes. One new non-endowed donor advised fund was established this year by Thomas Ritchey, III.

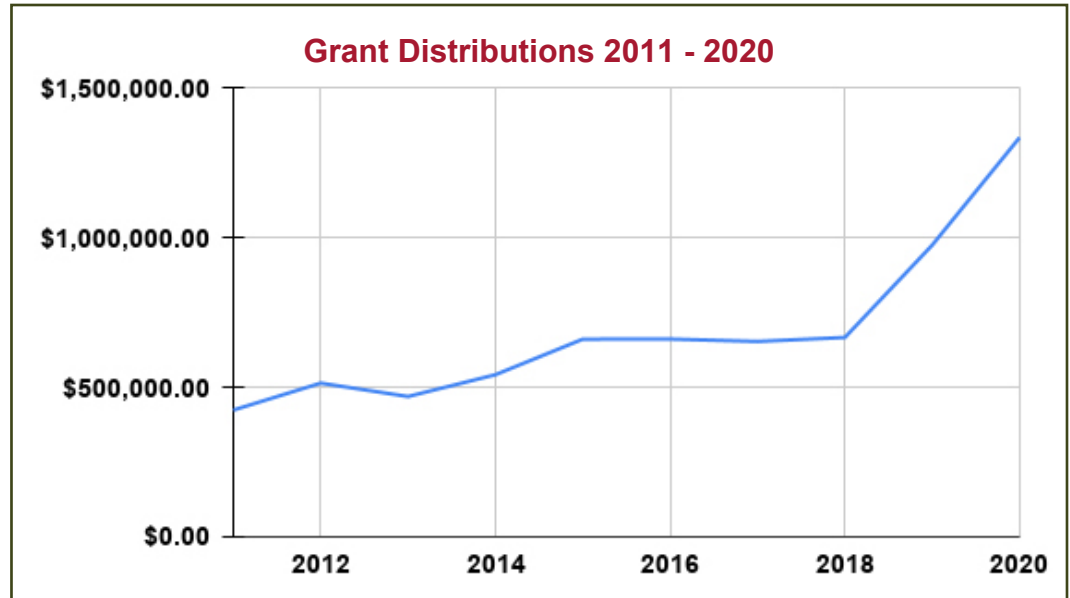

# Giving Back

The generous people who established the funds we manage were thinking ahead when they gave away their money. They had the foresight to create a permanent endowment as a gift to present and future generations. Their funds benefit specific organizations, areas of interest and scholarships. Many have also allowed us to decide how to use the money with a gift towards our *Unrestricted Fund*. We give back to our community with grants from these funds.

We have distributed more than \$9.8 million between 1998 and 2020. Grants and scholarships distributed last



year totaled \$1,335,905.67. Details of these grants are listed in the following pages.

### Discretionary Grants

Most of our funds have specified beneficiaries who are to receive grants each year.

However, we have the discretion to choose how the money is spent from six of our funds. We consider this to be the most interesting part of our work because we can direct

money where it is most needed. We prioritize giving to improve upon the effectiveness of existing programs and support projects that incorporate preventative or curative approaches to the problems and challenges of our community.

We award discretionary grants twice each year from several funds. Grants from the *Crawford Heritage Community Foundation Unrestricted Fund* and *Ben Franklin Trust* support projects in all parts of Crawford County. Titusville-area projects are financed from the *Fred Lintner Fund* and the *Titusville Fund*. Programs for children and youth receive support from the *Bernadene R. and John B. Cooley Fund*. Grants from the *Marian and Vincent Barsch Fund* support cemetery preservation projects throughout Crawford County. Faith-based and religious

### Pre-Pandemic Grants

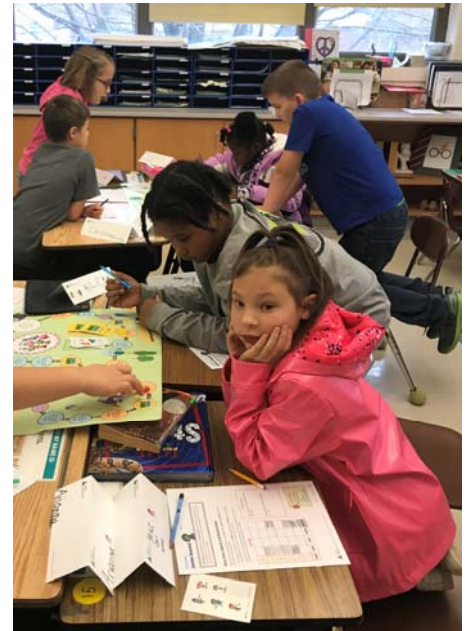
Our January round of discretionary grantmaking yielded twenty-four awards—totaling \$31,446.52.

*“We must be strategic about how we direct our discretionary grant funding,”* noted Jennifer Mohtashemi, chair of the Foundation’s grantmaking committee. *“Although we’ve been able to award more and more each year, current demand for funding still exceeds our resources. Ultimately, we want to support projects not only that will have the greatest impact on our community, but also those that we can expect to be successful. It’s very inspiring to see all of this great work happening in Crawford County and we’re excited to see these projects come to fruition.”*

The **Academy Theatre** used \$1,000.00 to purchase costumes and sets for their summer youth Broadway choreography camp.

**Americans for the Competitive Enterprise System, Inc. (ACES)** received \$1,000.00 to implement the Pennsylvania Business Week program in the PENNCREST School District. The program educates students about the benefits of the free enterprise system.

**Benson Memorial Library** used \$1,000.00 to improve public programming by upgrading and replacing educational tablets, a computer and a projection screen.

**Bethesda Lutheran Services** received \$1,000.00 to improve play conditions for children by upgrading old playground equipment.

**Child Development Centers, Inc.** used \$1,300.00 to further develop the new toddler playscape at the Willow Child Development Center.

**Common Roots** improved safety and living conditions at their property on South Main Street in Meadville by using \$2,500.00 to purchase materials to build a double-decker porch. The residence is projected to add safe and affordable rental units to the housing market.

**Crawford County Coalition on Housing Needs** received \$2,500.00 to defray the cost of replacing the roof on their South Main property, a homeless shelter residence for families.

The **Crawford County Historical Society** used \$1,000.00 to purchase a microfilm reader/printer, a modern-day necessity that will facilitate community historical research at the Tarr Mansion.

The **Crawford County School for Adult Education** improved their services by using \$1,500.00 to purchase computer software and an upgraded printer.

**Greendale Cemetery** is recognized for its historic, park-like grounds covering more than two-hundred acres in West Mead Township. A diseased maple tree was removed with the help of \$1,085.00.

**Hatch Cemetery** is located on Route 198 between Blooming Valley and Guys Mills. Although the burial ground is no longer active, it serves as the final resting place for over 250 people, thirty-four of which are veterans. Costs associated with the removal of a dead ash tree and the trimming two maple trees were defrayed with \$1,000.00.

Students who participate in Junior Achievement programs earn incomes 20% higher than their peers, are 30% more likely to attain a bachelor's degree and find it easier to secure stable employment. **Junior Achievement of Western PA** used \$1,000.00 to support their career pathway programs for students in Crawford County.

The **Meadville Area**

**Recreation Foundation** received \$1,000.00 to provide lunch and snacks to local children participating in the Summer Parks Program.

**Meadville Community Theatre** will enhance its audience experience by using \$1,000.00 to purchase new wireless microphones for their performers.

The **Meadville Garden Club** hosts the bi-annual Trees of Christmas event, the proceeds of which support the Baldwin Reynolds House Museum. They received \$1,500.00 to publicize the live Christmas tree display in hopes of attracting more attendees and improving fundraising revenue. (The event was postponed to 2021.)

The **Meadville Public Library** received \$2,450.00 to repair the gutters and rainwater drainage systems of the Helene Barco-Duratz Cultural Center, located on Chestnut Street in Meadville.

The **Oil Region Alliance of**

**Business, Industry & Tourism** was awarded \$1,000.00 to increase participation and provide support for their summer youth Journalism Camp at the Tarbell House in Titusville.

The **Richmond Township Recreation Board** will be able to remodel the community bathrooms at the Richmond Township Recreation Center with the help of \$954.00.

The **Rotary Club of Titusville** hosts a Christmas party for economically-disadvantaged children, provides scholarships to local students to attend leadership and service camps, and funds service trips abroad. They continued their youth programming with the help of \$2,000.00.

The **Saegertown Area Library** used \$500.00 to grow their special collection of graphic novels to promote youth literacy.

**Second District Elementary School** received \$1,000.00 to improve and expand the BARK (Behavior Interventions and Supports) Program. This incentive-based program encourages positive behavior on the part of students.

**South Lake Preserve** received \$1,000.00 to defray costs associated with the planning and construction of a gazebo in Ice House Park in Conneaut Lake.

The **Wayland Cemetery** is located in East Mead Township. Cemetery maintenance,

monument preservation and dead tree removal was supported with \$800.00.

**Western Pennsylvania Conservancy** worked to control invasive species on its Venango Riffle Preserve by using \$1,100.00 to purchase and apply herbicide.

The **YMCA of Titusville** used \$1,507.52 to repair exercise machines and improve the member experience.

The **Young Women’s Christian Association (YWCA) of Titusville** received \$1,000.00 to support programs teaching self-sufficiency and economic independence strategies to local homeless or near-homeless

people in the community.

**Emergency Response Fund - COVID-19 Grants**

We had the added challenge of responding to the COVID-19 pandemic this year. In April, we established an *Emergency Response Fund* to raise money to respond to needs that

we knew would arise from the crisis. More than \$39,000 was raised and then granted for this purpose.

We temporarily modified our grantmaking policy to allow grantees to use the money they received for their general operating support if they so chose. We awarded twelve of these grants (listed below).

Additional grants to eight organizations were awarded from our traditional discretionary sources.

**Bridge Studios** provides a music instruction and performance venue in Titusville. They used \$625 to purchase a surveillance system.

The **Crawford County**

**Conservation District** provides environmental instruction programs in local schools. They pivoted to on-line programming. A grant of \$400 helped them to purchase a high resolution video camera.

**Family Service and Children’s Aid Society** used \$2,367 to subsidize operational costs.

**Love in the Name of Christ of Titusville** used \$3,000 to subsidize rent, utility and automobile payments for people impacted by the pandemic.

**Titusville Area Hospital** used \$3,000 to subsidize operational costs.

**Titusville Historical Society** used \$1,000 to subsidize operational costs.

**United Way of the Titusville Region** used \$2,000 to provide financial support and other assistance to people impacted by the pandemic.

The **YMCA of Titusville** purchased personal protective equipment and cleaning supplies with \$1,943.

## Donor Advised Funds

A donor-advised fund allows you to contribute cash or other assets to create a fund for managing your individual philanthropic interests. You recommend grants to favorite charities and causes while we provide expert advice, verify the charitable nature of the organizations, write the checks and manage all tax, legal, and accounting matters.

We offer both endowed and non-endowed donor advised funds. There is no minimum amount to start a non-endowed fund and the entire amount may be directed to charity over time. Think of it as a charitable debit account. Conversely, endowed funds are permanently invested and never completely spent. Each year a percentage is made available for grants. (A minimum gift of \$5,000 is needed to establish an endowed fund.)

## Scholarship Funds

We direct funding from Scholarship Funds to select students meeting eligibility criteria (for example, financial need, field of study or academic merit) defined when the fund was established.

We are a partner with the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency (PHEAA) in the Partnerships for Access to Higher Education (PATH) Program. Through the PATH program, PHEAA potentially provides a match of scholarships awarded by the Foundation. To be eligible, students must be enrolled in a Pennsylvania college, be a state grant recipient and have additional unmet financial need. We leveraged matching funds for thirty-three students, representing seventeen of our scholarship programs. The awards ranged between \$300 and \$3,000 and totaled \$35,030. Recipients of PATH matching grants are designated with an asterisk (\*).

We accepted gifts of cash in addition to credit card giving in our second year. The on-line giving platform at provided a simple and functional way for donors to make their charitable gift in a secure manner. Donors reported that the site was as simple to use as any on-line store. They were able to select the organizations they wished to support and assign gift amounts for each one. Checkout with a credit card payment was quick and efficient. Gift receipts were immediately sent by email. More than 80% of donors also covered the cost of credit card payment, ensuring that more money would go to their selected charities.

We are deeply grateful for the outpouring of enthusiasm and generosity from our donors and the hard work put in by the participating organizations.

The third **Crawford Gives** will run for forty-eight hours on Monday, August 30 and Tuesday, August 31.

The second annual **Crawford Gives** eclipsed what was accomplished in our inaugural year. It was a significant milestone in our effort to build our region's culture of philanthropy. We worked for months to register the participation of one hundred fifteen diverse charitable organizations that serve our region.

Each participating organization created a profile on the [crawfordgives.org](http://crawfordgives.org) web site. They used text, pictures and video to showcase the good work they do to make Crawford County a better place

to live, learn, work and raise a family.

Over the course of forty-eight hours 1,231 unique donors from across the country made gifts totaling \$379,848.84. The total number of donors increased by 388 from 2019. Participating organizations reported gifts from many new donors. Through the generosity of Palmiero Toyota, Universal Pressure Pumping, Armstrong, an anonymous donor and our own funding a gift matching pool was established with \$40,000. Every organization

## Dwight Haas Bequest Society

The *Dwight Haas Bequest Society* honors those people who have invested in our community's future by including the Crawford Heritage Community Foundation as a beneficiary in their estate plan.

Planned gifts from estates benefit the community in perpetuity. They may be directed towards one of our current beneficiary organizations or funds, or can be used to establish a new fund for nearly any charitable purpose you wish. A minimum gift amount is not required. However, at least \$5,000 is needed to establish a new fund. We don't require you to tell us the amount of your gift. But, if you plan to start a new fund, we encourage you to discuss the details with us to ensure that we can comply with your wishes.

Charitable bequests are typically included as provisions in a will, but there are other options. You can also make the Foundation the beneficiary (in whole or in part) of an insurance policy, charitable trust, individual retirement account (IRA) or 401K.

To join the *Bequest Society*, simply notify us in writing of your intent. We provide a confidential statement of intent form for this purpose. Your planned gift may be altered at any time.

We recommend that you discuss a planned gift with a financial and legal advisor to ensure that it meets your needs while it benefits the community. Contact a Foundation representative to

discuss how we can assist you to leave a legacy.

The bequest society is named in honor of Dwight Haas, retired Executive Director of the United Way of Western Crawford County. Dwight came to our community from Dayton,

Ohio, where they have had a community foundation since 1921. He thought it essential that one be created here. After his retirement, Dwight spurred the effort to establish the foundation and served on our Board of Directors for fourteen years.
