Our Report to the Community

Over the past five years we have seen significant changes to Crawford County, and the community has exhibited extraordinary endurance to overcome global forces. This is an example of how we demonstrate our resilience and resolve. We continue to adapt to the challenges and overcome the obstacles and end the year on a positive note. As always, we celebrate you, your friends and neighbors, all of whom have helped us make an impact this year and in the past. You—and many others like you—are improving our community and deserve our profound gratitude.

In this report of our activities in 2022, we highlight the generosity of many people, how we've invested the money that has been given, and the

grants we have distributed from our funds. We also report about the fourth annual *Crawford Gives* and the more than \$700,000 that was raised in just 48 hours!

We received a significant amount in charitable gifts and new funds were

established. We now manage 161 endowed funds from which we have distributed more than \$13 million in grants since 1998. Our funds benefit more than 100 different organizations, scholarships and charitable purposes. As more is entrusted to us, we're able to give more to improve Crawford County.

Our mission is to connect generous people in our community with worthwhile charitable causes. Our donors give towards scholarships, interest areas (such as the arts, education or the environment) and specific nonprofit organizations. Many simply ask us to give their money where it is most needed.

We permanently invest a significant portion of the money

that is given to us. Each and every year—forever—a percentage is paid to support charitable organizations, programs and scholarships. Most were designated by our donors to receive grants every year. Our donors have also empowered us to direct a small number of grants where we think they will do the most good. As a fund grows, more money goes to support these philanthropic purposes. Much more than the amount originally given will be paid out over time.

We accept gifts in many forms including cash, stock, bonds and property. You can make gifts during your lifetime or leave a bequest through instructions in your will. When you notify us of your intentions to leave a bequest, we'll show our appreciation by enrolling you in our *Dwight Haas Bequest Society*. We hope you will think about your charitable giving and how you can make a difference in our community.

Your support is truly appreciated. We hope we can count on you to continue to help us build a strong foundation for a better community.

A 14th century proverb states that “*great oaks from little acorns grow.*” An acorn and an oak leaf figure prominently in our logo. These are both popular symbols for community foundations. The planted acorn represents the start of a fund. It will grow into a strong oak over time. The leaves can be seen as the grant dollars that are distributed from a fund each year. The tree develops and spreads its branches. More leaves grow. The small, but meaningful, grants of a fund's early years grow larger to make a greater impact.



Stewardship

Over the last five years we have grown by nearly \$7 million. That is an average of \$1.4 million in gifts and investment returns each year. We closed the books on 2022 with \$28,658,142.61 in assets under management.

Investment markets experienced significant volatility, leading to a decrease in our investment portfolio of -15.7% from year-end 2021 when we had \$34,011,548.30.

While the current volatile market conditions have resulted in a decrease in our investment portfolio, it's important to maintain a long-term perspective. History has shown that markets tend to go through periods of volatility followed by periods of stability and growth. Therefore,

we are confident that our investment approach will yield positive results in the future when volatile market conditions abate, just as it did following recessions in 2001 and 2008.

We have continued our fund management relationships with four financial institutions— PNC, First National Bank of Pennsylvania, Northwest Savings Bank, and ErieBank. Each institution maintained compliance with our *Administrative and Spending Policies and Operating Procedures*.

We distributed 4 percent of the value of each of our permanently endowed funds in 2022.

Annual Audit: We complete a yearly audit to meet regulatory requirements and to demonstrate

our financial integrity to the community. Our year-end financial statements for 2021 were audited by McGill, Power, Bell & Associates, LLP.

The auditors' opinion was that our financial statements presented fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Crawford Heritage Community Foundation. This is the highest level of assurance that an auditor can provide. The audit and our IRS Form 990 are available for review on our profile at [Guidestar.org](https://www.guidestar.org).

We achieved the Gold Transparency seal from Guidestar for 2022 in recognition of our commitment to actively sharing details about our finances and operations.

Giving

In 2022 we received gifts from 1,300 individual people and couples who gave \$2,375,158.00 to establish new funds, add to 161 existing funds and pass through gifts to 169 organizations through *Crawford Gives*.

One scholarship and two area of interest funds were created. These endowed funds will provide a permanent source of financial support for their charitable purposes.

All three funds are permanently invested and each year a percentage of their value is paid out as grants. More money is granted as the endowments grow.

Area of Interest Funds

Donors area of interest funds identify broad fields (for example, arts, education or youth) toward which the foundation directs funding through its discretionary

grantmaking process.

The sons of Wayne and Jessie Stainbrook—Dan, Bruce, Lyle and Ted—established the ***Wayne A. and Jessie B. Stainbrook Fund*** in memory of their parents. This permanent charitable endowment will benefit agricultural, environmental, and conservation programs and projects, as well as youth education in those four

areas. Wayne A. and Jessie B. Stainbrook worked together for a lifetime committed to agriculture and service to community. They understood that as times change, so does agriculture, and that it's important to preserve the future of agriculture in Northwestern Pennsylvania.

The ***Tom, Becky and Geoff Hall Fund*** is an area of interest fund established by the Hall family. It benefits the performing arts, creative arts programming, animal rescue organizations, or purchase of physical books for libraries.

Benjamin Franklin's Legacy

Benjamin Franklin's foresight and generosity are an example to us all. He left instructions in his will for a gift of \$5,000 (more than \$120,000 in today's dollars) that was to be invested for 200 years. At the end of that period he directed that the money be used to benefit residents of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the City of Philadelphia.

In 1991, a portion of the \$2 million that had accrued was distributed to Pennsylvania's community foundations.

We continue to invest a small portion of Mr. Franklin's money (*Ben Franklin Trust*) and distribute a percentage each year as discretionary grants to benefit programs serving Crawford County.

Giving Back

The generous people who established the funds we manage were thinking ahead when they gave away their money. They had the foresight to create a permanent endowment as a gift to present and future generations.

Discretionary Grants

Most of our funds have specified beneficiaries who are to receive grants each year. However, we have the discretion to choose how the money is spent from six of our funds. We consider this to be the most interesting part of our work because we can direct money where it is most needed. We prioritize giving to improve upon the effectiveness of existing programs and support projects that incorporate preventative or curative approaches to the problems and challenges of our community.

We award discretionary grants twice each year from several funds. Grants from the *Crawford Heritage Community Foundation Unrestricted Fund* and *Ben Franklin Trust* support projects in all parts of Crawford County. Titusville-area projects are financed from the *Fred Lintner Fund* and the *Titusville Fund*. Programs for children and youth receive support from the *Bernadene R. and John B. Cooley Fund*. Grants from the *Marian and Vincent Barsch Fund* support cemetery preservation projects throughout Crawford County. Faith-based and religious programs in the Titusville-area may apply for funding from the *Albert L. Carlson Fund*.

The first round of grants in January yielded twenty-nine awards –totaling \$49,404.

“We hope our grants are helping to improve lives. The changes are

as simple as helping a library buy books and as technological as the purchase of a drone. This money helped children and adults to become better educated, enhance the work of health and social service providers and support historical and arts programs,” said Christian Maher, Executive Director.

The **Academy Theatre** was awarded \$1,500.00 to purchase wireless radios for production staff communications.

Allegheny College/ Creek Connections received \$2,500 for new water monitoring supply kids for Crawford County Creek Connections Schools.

Bethesda Lutheran Services received \$2,000.00 to provide off-campus field trips for children.

Cambridge Springs Public Library Association received \$700 to purchase a storage cabinet for craft supplies.

Center for Family Services undertook strategic planning support with a \$4,600.00 grant.

The City of Titusville Police Department put \$2,000 towards the reinstatement of the K-9 program.

Common Roots improved energy efficiency at their property on South Main Street in Meadville by using \$1,250.00 to install repurposed solar panels.

Crawford County Coalition on Housing Needs received \$2,490.00 to replace flooring in a unit of the South Main Place homeless shelter residence for families.

Erie Homes for Children and Adults received \$1,000 towards the replacement of bathing chairs in their Titusville area homes.

Food4Thought extended Walkable Meadville's city pathway and continued work on the Children's Garden with \$2,738.00.

French Creek Community Theatre received \$1,850.00 to update sound equipment.

French Creek Valley Conservancy used \$2,000.00 to purchase equipment for the French Creek

Stewardship Program.

The **Hatch Cemetery Association** used \$841.00 to remove poison ivy and prepare soil for future plantings.

James A. Stone Memorial Library defrayed the cost of building repairs and upgrades with \$1,400.00.

Margaret Shontz Memorial Library expanded their offerings to include STEAM education and experience materials for Story Hour and After School Tutoring programs with \$1,200.00.

The **Meadville Area Free Clinic** continued to provide quality healthcare through the purchase of a medical-grade refrigerated storage unit. They received \$2,000.00.

The **Meadville Market Authority** received \$1,980.00 to continue to strengthen the Farmer's Market through advertising and a streamlined payment system.

The **Meadville Public Library** received \$1,212.00 to purchase folding tables for patron use.

The Meadville Bike Share will get two additional bicycles through \$2,000.00 given to the **Northwest PA Mobility Alliance, Inc.**

Saegertown Area Library benefited from a space-saving book display in the children's room with \$1,362.00.

Titusville Area Health Center Foundation received \$1,000 toward an ongoing project to replace all hospital

Titusville Literacy Council received \$1,070.00 for GED practice test vouchers and transportation vouchers to assist students in earning their diploma.

The Ed Meyer Complex in Titusville benefited from the planting of shade trees in a joint effort of the **Titusville Shade Tree Commission** and Titusville High School Cross Country team. The project received \$1,050.

The **Western Pennsylvania Conservancy** constructed a new hiking trail in the Tyron-Weber Woods in Sadsbury Township with \$2,311.00 to defray a portion of the cost.

Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA) of Titusville received a \$1,443.00 grant to purchase a seated upper body ergometer.

Another thirty organizations received grants in the second round of grantmaking in July—totaling \$46,819.59.

We honor their trust by supporting projects that improve people's lives in direct and indirect ways," said Christian Maher, Executive Director. *"As the only community foundation serving Crawford County, we permanently invest what is given to us. Each and every year, forever, we make grants with a percentage of that endowment."*

The **Academy Theatre Foundation** improved the quality of productions with a grant of \$2,000 for the theatre's lighting and sound system with four portable dimmer racks and microphones for the actors.

The **Active Aging Foundation** used \$659 for a wheelchair to increase accessibility for center patrons.

Conneaut Lake Area Historical Society's purchased display cases for their collection with \$800.

The **Crawford County Historical Society**

supported the preservation of Sugar Lake Cemetery. They received \$3,600 towards this effort.

East Mead Volunteer Fire Company received \$1,275 for supplies for their emergency medical technicians.

Family Service and Children's Aid Society of Venango County used \$1,200 to support in-person activities for youth and their mentors who participate in the Youth Connection program serving eastern Crawford County.

The Foundation for Sustainable Forests bolstered their ongoing capacity building initiatives with a new printer and ink. They received \$421.

(A minimum gift of \$5,000 is needed to establish an endowed fund.)

Through the PATH program, PHEAA potentially provides a match of scholarships awarded by the Foundation. To be eligible, students must be enrolled in a Pennsylvania college, be a state grant recipient and have additional unmet financial need. We leveraged matching funds for thirty-three students, representing seventeen of our scholarship programs. The awards ranged between \$125 and \$2,500 and totaled \$33,887.00. Recipients of PATH matching grants are designated with an asterisk (*).

Crawford Gives reached new heights!



We are thrilled to report that the fourth annual **Crawford Gives** on August 30 and 31, 2022 was a huge success. It was a significant milestone in our effort to build our region's culture of philanthropy. We worked to register more than one hundred diverse charitable organizations that serve our region. Each participating organization created a profile on the web site. Many organizations joined us for live broadcasts on social media to promote their mission and

explain how they make an impact. Over the course of forty-eight hours, 1,178 unique donors from across the country made gifts totaling \$716,417. Each participating organization received a gift from an average of ___ donors and each gift averaged \$197. Through the generosity of **Palmiero Toyota, Armstrong, Shafer Law Firm, and Allegheny Realty Settlement**, and anonymous donors, a gift matching pool was established with \$43,000.00. Every organization received an additional 6 cents for every dollar given. The on-line giving platform at crawfordgives.org was developed to provide a simple and functional way for donors

to make their charitable gift in a secure manner. Donors reported that the site was as simple to use as any on-line store. They were able to select the organizations they wished to support and assign gift amounts for each one. Checkout with a credit card payment was quick and efficient. Gift receipts were immediately sent by email. We are deeply grateful for the outpouring of enthusiasm and generosity from our donors and the hard work put in by the participating organizations.
